

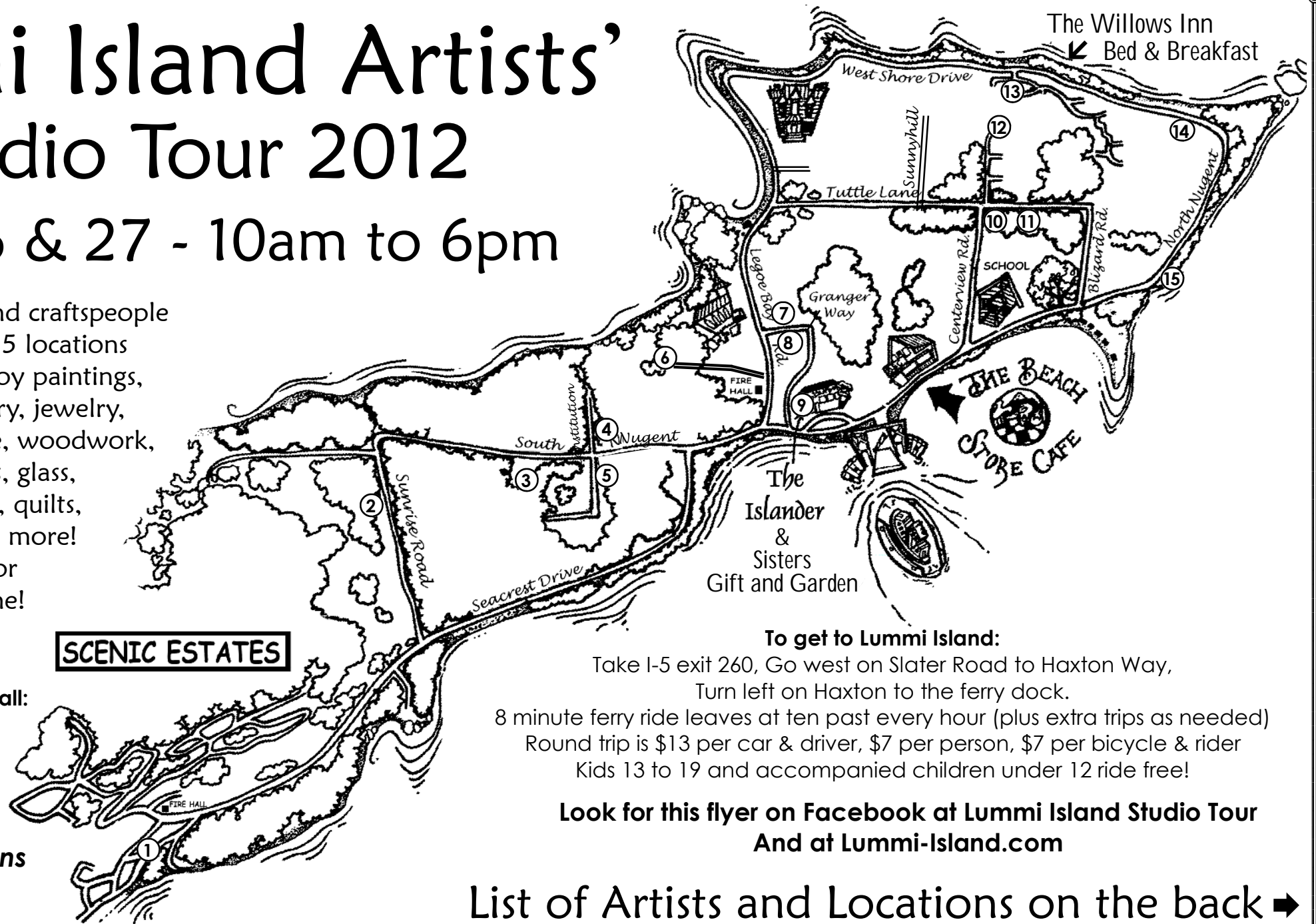
Lummi Island Artists' Studio Tour 2012
